Women were given different off-farm and non-farm trainings through federations and SHGs to help them stand on their feet and to be self-sufficient. Through the 'no-free' policy, while BSSS tried to create sustainability of the project activities by enabling the beneficiaries to generate fund for themselves, keen interest was also given to facilitate change in the basic attitude of the people towards NGOs and service organisations. In different parts of our operational areas, more than 200 weaker and drop out children are being regularly catered to good education enabling them to be in the main stream with other children, through the bridge-up centres. People vulnerable to the nature's fury as well, are being prepared to cope up with the situations of flood, drought and other natural calamities.

Counting all our blessings and accomplishments with great sense of fulfillment and gratitude to God Almighty, I would like to acknowledge the great support of our donor agencies and I value and appreciate them for their great concern for the humanity. 

PRAJWALA SWARAKSHA PROGRAMME I ANTI HUMAN TRAFFICKING





GOAL

To condense/stamp out Human Trafficking

OBJECTIVE

To create public awakening on the issue of human trafficking by motivating the community to protect themselves by education and better vigilance









The programme was initiated by the organisation 'Prajwala' of Hyderabad and it covered all the districts of Andhra, Telangana and Odisha. It is implemented in 9 Blocks of Keonjhar, Mayurbhanj, Balasore and Bhadrak districts by BSSS in collaboration with distric administration.



The SWARAKSHA programme aimed to create public awakening on the issue of human trafficking by motivating the community to protect themselves through education and better vigilance. In the last one year, 11 awareness programmes were conducted within the operational area of BSSS, where 9,350 participants were sensitised. These programmes included:

- Roadways awareness rally and awareness meetings at Block and District headquarters
- Awareness through placard, flex banner, video show, posters, signature campaign, motorcycle rally
- Community awakening CARAVAN (Bus/Ratha) to counter trafficking

DEVELOPMENT OF REAL EMPOWERMENT THROUGH AGRICULTURAL MISSION | DREAM

The DREAM project aims to address food insecurity among communities in Keuntinimari and Betna gram panchayat by increasing food availability and improving access to food through increased agricultural productivity and enhanced income generation



The DREAM project is implemented in Baripada Sadar & Kuliana blocks of Mayurbhanj district. It covered 25 villages in 2 panchayats impacting the lives of 2,978 families.



MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS

- More than 786 famers enhanced their knowledge on the proper techniques of sustainable agriculture
- 60 to 70% of the direct beneficiaries as well as a considerable number of indirect beneficiaries have adopted summer ploughing, soil testing, seed & seedling treatment, integrated pest management and integrated nutrient management.
- More than 40% of record growth of the production of stress tolerant variety paddy reported in 2016 Kharif season in the target area.
- Integrated Farming System (IFS), organic vegetable and grow bag cultivation is being practiced by the beneficiaries.
- Farmer's federations and SHGs are linked with Govt. departments and availing benefits for different cultivations like horse gram, green gram, banana, maze and chicks from KVK.
- SHGs have taken up different IGPs like mushroom cultivation, surf powder and phenol making.
- Keutinimari Farmer's federation raised Rs. 309,024. and Betna Farmers federation have Rs. 133,342 for its sustainable development.

SUSTAINABLE AND PARTICIPATORY RURAL EMPOWERMENT THROUGH AGRI-BASED LIVELIHOOD DEVELOPMENT | SPREAD



The SPREAD project aims to strengthen the capacity of the target households in securing their livelihood and increase food productivity. It also explores the possibilities of innovative water conservation methods to better



manage the natural resources. SPREAD focuses on building capacity and advocacy linkages of all target farmers to access government schemes.

The SPREAD project is implemented in Bangiriposi block of Mayurbhanj district. It covers 45 villages in 3 panchayats of Sorisapal, Chakidi, Brahmangaon impacting lives of 2,173 families.

- Recruited all the staffs for the project
- Staff orientation training

The broad aim of this study is to explore the possible complementarities between drought tolerant cultivars and weather index insurance. While these two risk management tools can be conceptualised as complements, it is possible that farmers - intended customers of both products - might view them more like substitutes rather than complements.

MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS

Training have been conducted for 17 Enumerators on farmers' baseline survey. During the project period Sahabhagi paddy (drought resistant) and drought insurance was sold in 74 villages. Besides rain gauge machines were installed in Khaira, Oupada, Kaptipada, Thakurmunda, Banta and Agarpada blocks.

- During Rabi, we have covered 2496 farmers for 1791 acres of Land with 9650 kg of green gram and 4676 kg of black gram in 17 block of 4 districts.

Under the project Bridge-up Classes (BuCs) for drop out students have started in the villages. At present 5 such BuCs are running in the villages where 67 students are attending regularly. The students regularly undertake village cleanliness drive and skillbased, leadership and agricultural training have been provided to the community members in order to improve their livelihood opportunities. The members of the Farmers' Clubs have received Stress Tolerant Rice Variety (STRV) paddy seed support. Training orientation on government schemes were given to the community.

MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS

- Farmers are cultivating maize in group approach on leased land by the support of CSISA
- During this year an agricultural loan amounting to Rs 1,95,000 was provided by AKM to 65 member farmers for both Khariff and Rabi season with an interest 1% per month.
- AKM took an initiative to provide family ration kits to 33 members for Rs 330. These items included soap (bath and wash) Colgate paste, edible oil etc. & achieved 12.8% profit.
- 15 women SHGs are active and linked to different line departments and they are now engaged in mushroom cultivation. They received KVK support for chicks rearing.
- AKM took an initiative of collective marketing of necessary household articles for its fund generation. These items included soap (bath & wash), tooth paste, edible oil etc. and achieved 12.8% of profit.
