The urge to bring about meaningful change in the lives of innumerous people in the remote rural areas of the Diocese of Balasore prompted the Church to step into social work. Covering four civil districts of the diocese such as Balasore, Bhadrak, Keonjhar and Mayurbhanj, a social service wing was set up as a vital organ of the Diocese. A special cell was assigned for the social wing. The year was 1992. Fr. Paul Kidangan was appointed as the first director of the social wing.

In 1993, under Fr. Jacob Kallupurackal an office was established at Deepthi Bhavan, Pastoral centre at Kuruda, Balasore. It was he who baptised the social service wing as Balasore Social Service Society or BSSS. Since then BSSS has been closely involved in several works for the upliftment of the poor people in the operational areas. BSSS has witnessed the horrors of the super cyclone that played havoc in the state. In response it played a herculean role in relief and rehabilitation of the thousands of people in the four districts of the Diocese. The relief service done by the BSSS is a landmark in the annals of history.

In 2002, the social service society moved to its newly constructed building in Balasore as it continued to serve the poor, marginalised and people affected by disasters, with even more resolute. BSSS braved the cyclones like Phailin and Hudhud to reach the unreached and provided relief and rehabilitation to thousands of people.

2017 marks the 25 year of the success of BSSS. To BSSS, these 25 years, are years of Grace. It believes that without the Grace from the Almighty it would have been impossible to reach this milestone in the journey. It also believes, without the people the existence of BSSS would have been meaningless. This amazing journey of a quarter century is therefore a humble reminder to BSSS that nothing is impossible for God and everything is possible for people who believe in Him.

MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR



OVERVIEW BALASORE SOCIAL SERVICE SOCIETY

Balasore Social Service Society (BSSS) is the official social service wing of the Catholic Diocese of Balasore. It is a non profit organisation registered under the Society Registration Act of XXI of 1860. The registration number is 19342/61 of 1992-93.

BSSS operates in four districts of Odisha. These are Bhadrak, Balasore, Keonjhar and Mayurbhanj. The organisation works for the socially and economically deprived and other vulnerable sections of the society like the women, children, the disabled and the orphans irrespective of caste, creed and religion.

GOAL

Flood affected communities of Bhadrak district of Odisha reduced their loss significantly by protecting and strengthening their livelihood.





KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- 69 farmers have been exposed to different successful models (IFS, IAP, cash crops, organic manure and pests and floriculture) of sustainable livelihood practices along with seminar for enhancing their knowledge.
- 64 farmers have been exposed to flood resilient variety of crop SS-1 with crop cutting.
- 82 out of 400 flood affected HHs are practicing resilient measures and techniques for crops and vegetables in a sustainable manner.
- In order to attract and encourage other families to go for kitchen gardening BSSS has promoted convergence model of kitchen gardening in 16 families (grow bags with drip irrigation) on demonstration
- 22 target families have been trained on IGP ventures for increasing their household income.
- 65 farmers from program area have been registered under DBT to avail subsidies against purchase of seeds, pulses, fertilizers, agri-implements etc. from government.









DEVELOPMENT OF REAL EMPOWERMENT THROUGH AGRICULTURAL MISSION | DREAM

MAYURBHANJ DISTRICT | 2 BLOCKS | 2 PANCHAYATS | 25 VILLAGES

GOAL

Rural Households in Mayurbhanj District of Odisha have increased food security

- 242 farmers including members of FCs and SHGs from 25 villages acquired knowledge on care and management of livestock and about seasonal diseases of livestock.
- 230 cows, 199 goats and 55 sheep were vaccinated on FMD disease as preventive measures.
- Farmers of the program area have developed relationship with different line department of government, which never existed before. 189 individual farmers, 19 SHGs and 2 farmers' federation have received support of different line department of government
- 299 demo and lead farmers received knowledge on cultivation of Arum, Ginger, Turmeric, Elephant foot yam and Pole potato like cash crops.
- Farmers received close guidance for proper cultivation of cash crops as the animators have been provided with information leaflet on cash crops and its management
- The farmers of the program area are aware about the importance of Stress Tolerant Rice Variety (STRV) paddy seeds i.e. Swarna Sub-1, Sahabhagi , DRR-42, DRR-44 etc and its better productivity.





- 245 farmers have cultivated the same adopting Improved
 Agricultural Practices (IAP) i.e. seed treatment, seed bed preparation, line transplanting along-with integrated nutrient and pest management for increasing their production.
- 42 farmers have taken up fish cultivation in the small ponds created by them with azolla as a feeding.
- 67 farmers have covered their homestead/unused lands with fruit





plants, vegetables, maize etc.
FFs have accumulated in their accounts Rs. 5, 70,745.00 by various means of fund raising.

- Farmers' Federation mobilized manual farm machinery from KVK which will help the federation to earn more funds.
- Average yields per acre from the crop cutting are 18 quintals this year.
- Organic manure namely Bijamruta,
 Jibamruta and Pranamruta prepared
 with locally available materials for

crops attracted the farmers for adopting the same.

- The women farmers of SHGs supported with marigold saplings were found interested to cultivate the same for the first time for generating income.
- The Women are becoming more social and participating in the public program and meetings in groups .
- All the 6 BuCs are running with 90% attendance of students.
- Monthly test carried out shows improvement in the performance of all the 96 students.
 Parents of the students enrolled in the BuCs contributing tuition fees monthly for further continuation of centers without the support of BSSS.







MAYURBHANJ DISTRICT | BANGRIPOSI BLOCK | 3 PANCHAYATS | 45 VILLAGES

GOAL

Rural households in Mayurbhanja District of Odisha have increased food security.


- Recruited the Staffs for the project and gave orientation on the Project
- Training held for 8 Enumerators on Baseline Survey and survey completed in 45 villages.
- Orientation on project to the community in 45 villages
- 45 farmers club formed and strengthened.
- 22 cluster level training organized covering 45 villages and 478 farmers trained on the





- to the SHGs. Initial support provided to start phenyl making, Mahua soft drinks and sweets preparation, mushroom
 - cultivation provided under IGP. A total number of 676 farmers from 45 villages are supported with paddy seeds, for 500 acres of land for Kharif season cultivation.
 - Imparted Improved Agriculture Practices (IAP) skills to 551 farmers in 22 clusters
 - Training on Integrated Nutrient and Pest Management (INM & IPM) provided to the farmers of 45 villages.
 - Research study to explore different possibilities of water conservation conducted with the help of AFPRO.







- Supported various seeds for Rabi season cultivation from different sources for more than 1,000 farmers.
- Created 3 Farm mechanised Hub in 3 GPs and supported machineries
- Capacity building training for CBOs organised in 22 cluster covering 45 villages
- Participatory Learning and Action (PLA) at village level completed, prepared the community level planning and submitted in 3 GPs by the community members
- Workshop on Government schemes and linkages organised in 22 clusters
- Interface workshop at Block level organised and all the line departments participated in the workshop
- Developed and disseminated the IEC materials on IAP, IGP and preparation of biofertiliser and pesticides

There were more than a thousand farmers both men and women for the seminar. The seminar was inaugurated by Honourable MLA Remuna Mr. Gobinda Chandra Das. There were a number of agricultural experts from various department who gave their valuable sessions to the farmers and Fr. Mathew Karikulam, the former Director- BSSS moderated the whole session. The valedictory speech by the Honourable MLA Balasore Sadar Mr. Jiban Pradip Dash concluded the seminar cum exhibition by 4.PM.

The exhibition was inaugurated by the Sub Collector of Balasore, Mr. Manmath Kumar Pani. There were a number of professional agencies like International Rice Research Institute (IRRI) who took part of the exhibition and gave their own contributions to the participants. A number of SHG groups presented their products like phenyl and surf powder to the farmers which encouraged them to take initiatives for innovative actions for their progress.

There was BSSS alumni gathering at BSSS office in the morning, when the seminar took place at St. Vincent Convent School Campus. There were around 35 participants who worked in BSSS in early years who

shared their sweet memories while working with BSSS. Many of them gratefully pointed out how the valuable learnings from BSSS paved their way ahead in creating a bright future for them. BSSS family didn't forget to present them small gifts as a token of love in appreciation to their homecoming.

MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS OF MODEL PANCHAYAT

Updating of PLA and POA submission to Sarapancha and GPEO	 125 BPL families got residential houses under Pradhanmantri Awas Jojana.
Bridge up class for drop out students	 68 weak students of class III to V are regularly attending in BuCs and schools. 35 passed out students of BuC qualified in the entrance examination and got admission in Govt. schools including Odisha Adarsha Vidyalay. Rs. 15,458 have been collected towards Shikhya Bikash Panthi in 5 centres.
Strengthening Adarsha Bikash Sangathan (ABS)	 ABS has strengthened its Linkage with KVK, IRRI, CSISA and obtained support on pulses and vegetable seedlings. Fund status of ABS raised up to Rs. 115,876 and after expenditure savings amount is Rs. 90,611/
STRV Seed support from IRRI. Utilization of Barren land under cash crop cultivation. Rice Crop Manager (RCM)	 170 women farmers of 10 WSHGs adopted improved agriculture practices of Sahabhagi paddy cultivation and got a yield of 15 to 16 quintal per acre. 47 SHG mothers cultivated Arum, Turmeric, Ginger and Elephant Foot Yam under cash crop cultivation. They got 10 times production in Arum and 3 times production in Ginger and Turmeric and 2 times in Elephant foot Yam. 200 farmers have undergone with RCM process, used recommended fertilizers and got a good yield.







Record keeping system	 8 WSHGs along with ABS are able to maintain their Records like Resolution book, member's savings register, cash book and individual savings books.
Income generation by WSHG	 12 members of Maa Sahadasuni SHG are making Phenyl and washing powder, 10 members of Maa Durga and 12 of Saraswati shakti are adopting Pickle making, 10 members of Sagun Safali raised mushroom cultivation. 12 members of Saraswati Shakti are rearing piglings and 12 members of Maa Manasa SHG adopted Integrated Farming in group approach.
Project sharing workshop	124 farmers have registered under Direct Benefit Transfer Scheme after attending Project Achievement Sharing workshop.
Celebration of Gandhi Jayanti and Observation of International Women's day	 40 Children Parliament Members observed Gandhi Jayanti. 520 women observed International Women's Day on 8th March.
Donor's Visit	 Mrs Solange De Wattanile and Mrs Josette Tapanier, FdnF delegates visited project areas and evaluated program activities. Their positive remark encouraged us to go ahead.

- Twenty three volunteers selected for survey and data entry.
- For Kharif-17 a total number of 8,000 farmers surveyed and recommendation distributed.
- For Rabi-2017-18, 1,000 farmers surveyed and recommendations distributed.
- Among both the survey 10% of farmers followed the recommended advice.

INNOVATIONS IN TRAINING FOR WOMEN IN QUALITY SEED PRODUCTION

MAYURBHANJ DISTRICT | 2 BLOCKS | 2 PANCHAYATS | 15 VILLAGES

GOAL

Farmers of Mayurbhanj District of Odisha have access to quality seed



- A total of 340 woman farmers received training on modern agricultural package of practices
- A total of 72 training were given to the women farmers facilitating knowledge on modern agricultural practices and managing the quality seed.
- The women farmers were assisted with DRR 44 Paddy seed and fertilizers in order to install demo plots by their own.
- A total of 12 demonstration plots were created by the women farmers in both operational blocks, where they replicated their knowledge on modern agricultural practices, after receiving trainings.
- The woman farmers experienced the entire cultivation process by doing it themselves and the machinery transplantation in their field under the guidance of IRRI & BSSS
- Not only their production was increased to 40% but their confidence of doing cultivation in a modern way has been developed.
- The women farmers were able to keep good quality seed for themselves by using all the techniques in their cultivation processes.

STRENGTHENING SEED SYSTEM OF STRVS THROUGH INNOVATIVE DEMONSTRATIONS AND EXTENSION APPROACHES IN ODISHA, KHARIF 2017

4 DISTRICTS | 14 BLOCKS | 94 PANCHAYATS | 185 VILLAGES



GOAL

Strengthening Seed System of STRVs in Odisha

- Total 2,234 farmers were supported through Minikits, demonstrations and head to head trail.
- Farmers of low land areas were introduced to the flood resistance paddy varieties such as: Bina 11, Swarna Sub 1 & Cr 1009 Sub1 and upland areas were introduced to the drought resistance paddy seed varieties such as: DRR 42, DRR 44 & Sahabhagi Dhan.
- More than 700 Farmers received modern agricultural package of practices through training among them more than 500 farmers followed this in their fields
- The productivity of the farmers have increased and losses due to stress has been decreased resulting in increase of their income.
- Good relation with agriculture department has been established in our operational blocks


GOAL

To provide a boost to farmers income

- 146 farmers were supported with 792 kgs of black gram and 622 farmers were supported with 2,828 kgs of green gram for a total of 452.5 acres of land.
- Field days and trainings were organized in 12 blocks of 4 operational districts on safe storage of pulses seed and to motivate other farmers to cultivate pulses in Rabi season.
- More than 500 farmers have shown their interest to cultivate the pulses in next Rabi Season.


